

How to Identify the Parts of Speech

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Question 1. Does this word have one form only?

Yes. Then Noun, Pronoun, Verb and Pronoun are eliminated (except nihil).

Question 2. Does this word express an affection of the soul?

Yes. Then it is an **Interjection**.

No. Then Interjection is eliminated.

Question 3. Is this word set before a noun, pronoun or participle?

Yes. Then it is a **Preposition**.

No. Then Preposition is eliminated.

Question 4. Is this word used to join parts of speech together?

Yes. Then it is a **Conjunction**.

No. Then it is an **Adverb**.

No. Preposition, Adverb, Interjection, Conjunction are eliminated.

Question 2. Does this word signify time?

Yes. Then, Noun and Pronoun are eliminated.

Question 3. Does this word have cases?

Yes. Then it is a **Participle**.

No. Then it is a **Verb**.

No. Then, Verb and Participle are eliminated.

Question 3: Does this word stand in place of other nouns?

Yes. Then it is a **Pronoun**.

No. Then it is a **Noun**.
